Chris Terrell-Nield identified the harlequin ladybirds that I spotted in my garden - he has written about them on page 32. It is anticipated that they will out-compete our native ladybirds and deprive young birds of valuable insect feed.

We have reports on the concert in the church and Martin Kennard's challenging bike ride in the Pyrenees - Martin is the headteacher of Bunny School. There are photos of the first Bunny Allotment Holders barbecue and of ATC events. I managed to spot Julian Mullins on the ATC photos but couldn't find our other Bunny-boy member, William Alvey.
