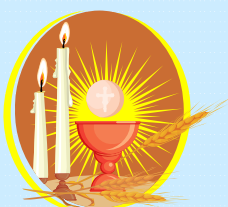

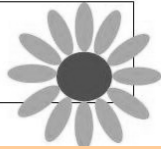

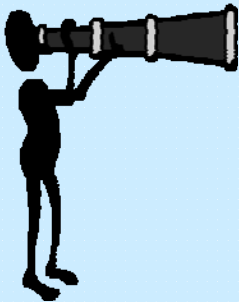


Our November meeting, 'Tales from
