


Welcome to the Bunny Bulletin

Line Spacing: Single


Do not indent the first line of a new paragraph

VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT FOR COMMUNITY ROAD SAFETY TEAM



Some years ago two attempts were made by Bunny Parish Council to set up a Community Speed Watch (CSW) group in Bunny. Each attempt failed due to a shortage of volunteers along with limited support from the local Police. But things have changed!

The first change is in the name (CSW to CRS); the second is considerable enthusiasm on the part of PC Kelly Carlile and her colleagues for supporting the setting up of new CRS groups in local villages; the third is a sharper focus in the village on speeding problems since the introduction of the 30 m.p.h. limit; and the fourth is the availability of new kit (embracing portable interactive speed signs and a speed gun) for the use of CRS teams.
