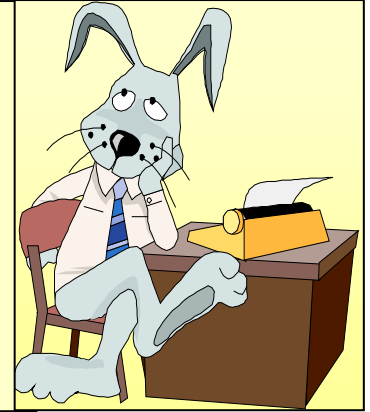


Welcome to the Bunny Bulletin
